



Lions Participate at Camp Possibilities

On July 28, the Bel Air Lions assisted with the Camp Possibilities Check-In day. That day, dozens of campers aged 8-16 moved into Camp Possibilities for a week of fun and learning to manage their diabetes under a very caring, controlled environment. We saw so many happy kids, so many excited counselors and counselors in training, and very calm and supportive medical staff and directors. One family, especially, was thrilled to see us there with our Lions hats because the Jarrettsville Lions had sponsored their daughter to attend Camp. It was a rewarding experience despite the heat!

At the volunteer and counselor lunch, Lions Graham Phillips; Bill Smith and Natalie Shaw talked with Amy Edgeworth and Jeff Dietz, both camp staff, about needs the camp has that we could assist with. Their biggest need is to help counselors and counselors in training who have diabetes and cannot afford insulin or who are sacrificing other things like textbooks or college to be able to pay for their insulin. There are many sacrifices being made to stay healthy, and the Camp is trying to alleviate those burdens when possible by finding long-term solutions.

On Wednesday, July 31, we got a tour of camp led by Jeff Dietz who showed the cabin that has been converted via Lion money and Lion volunteerism to "Camp Med," the medical assistance cabin where the campers check in every day on their sugar levels and their well-being. We saw the archery and fishing pond area, watched a game of the infamous "Gaga Ball," and checked out the dining hall where there are specific tools for the Campers to use to help them track their carbs. Also, the swimming pool is pretty amazing, and the medical staff working there are rockstars. They do sugar checks every fifteen to twenty minutes to keep the kids safe without their pumps. Campers were singing, dancing, excited to show us their cabins and their games. It was an incredible experience.

ELLICOTT CITY-COLUMBIA LIONS CLUB HIGHLIGHTS



A new school bus for Head Start, a preschool program for low income students throughout Howard County, Maryland, was dedicated on September 9, 2019 by the County Executive Calvin Ball. The Ellicott City-Columbia Lions Club, District 22A, donated \$40,000 for the bus.

Head Start provides

bus service for all its 200+ students in four locations. Its oldest bus had well over 100,000 miles and was costly to maintain. The CAC worked with the Club for a down payment on a new bus to replace the old one. The CAC then applied to the County for the balance of the cost. Dr. Ball enthusiastically budgeted money for the bus, and the County Council approved it.

The bus was dedicated to Lion John "Jack" Garrity, who spent thirty-five years in the Ellicott City Lions serving in all officer positions, Boys and Girls Committee Chair, and Hall Chair for maintenance and rentals. Decades of bingo in the hall provided the funds for community programs including the bus. Lion Jack was a WWII veteran wounded at the Battle of the Bulge, a prison warden, and retired as the County Animal Control Officer. His story telling was famous for maintaining the Club's oral history. Every new Lion, visitor, and Lion in District 22A that he met heard a story from Lion Jack.

PIP Kusiak lead the Lion delegation with District 22A Governor, Sam Foster and his wife, Diane Foster, Mayor Pro-Tem of Taneytown; Club members Alan Goldschen, President; Tom Hartman, Secretary; Darrell Kingsland, Treasurer; and Directors Susan Kingsland, Susan Hartman, and Susan Goldschen. State Senator Dr. Clarence Lam, a board member of CAC, also attended.



The Club honored County Executive Dr. Ball and Jennifer Grieb, the project coordinator for the Community Action Council (CAC) which operates Head Start with Melvin Jones Fellowships. Both recipients have been very important in supporting the Club's community activities with the Food Bank and Head Start.


HOST A VISION DAYS EVENT TO BENEFIT WILMER

First step – We visited with the Owner of Angel's Food Market requesting approval to hold Vision days, followed by a letter confirming the days. On behalf of the Severn River Lions Club, please accept our thanks for allowing our members to provide information about the Lions Vision center at the Hopkins Wilmer Eye Institute on Friday, September 6 and Saturday, September 7th. The information explains how Lions support vision programs at Wilmer.



We will also provide a news release announcing our presence at Angel's in the Maryland Gazette and Pasadena Voice. We will also collect used eyeglasses on the 6th and 7th. Second step – we created a Vision Days news release for two local newspapers providing the above information.

Next Step - Involving our members: The previous year's Vision Day single day event was discussed during the July General Meeting. A volunteer signup sheet for Vision Days became the start of creating 5 teams for the two-day event. After the meeting, a 10-minute orientation took place with the volunteer teams.

New this year: Volunteer teams; Team recognition for collecting donations. Testimonials by donors relating to their experiences with Lions etc.

Final Step – Requested each volunteer complete a short questionnaire. Results would be tabulated and communicated to each volunteer. Next year's Vision Days will include the additions and or changes.






