Melvin was born on a Calvary outpost in Camp Thomas, Arizona on January 13, 1879. At age 33, Melvin, after schooling at the Union Business and Chaddock Colleges of Quincy, Illinois, was sole owner of an insurance company and became a member of the local business circle. In 1917, after pursuing the thought that he and other influential businessmen, could be better utilized their talents in other areas of community life, they formed what is now known as LIONS CLUBS INTERNA-TIONAL, with 20 delegates representing 27 clubs from around the United States. The Association became International in 1920, when the Lions of Detroit chartered the Windsor Ontario Lions club in Canada. In 1950, Melvin Jones was conferred to title of SECRETARY GENERAL of LIONS INTERNATIONAL for life. Since that time Lions organization have grown to over 1.4 million members in over 47,000 clubs in over 200 countries. Lionism's dedication to aiding the blind grew out of a speech by Helen Keller in 1925, when she challenged the Lions to become her "knights of the blind in the crusade against darkness". In today's

Lions world Lions not only dedicate themselves to the visually impaired but to programs for

preventable, corrective eye diseases and hearing impaired. Melvin Jones, the founder of this great service organization died in 1961. His philosophy of life, "you can't get very far until you start doing something for somebody else." lives in our motto WE SERVE.

In 1961, the International Board of Directors proclaimed January 13 (the birthday of our founder, Melvin Jones), as a day of memory each year throughout the world of Lionism. January was designated as Melvin Jones Memorial month. Thereafter, every year on the Saturday closest to the 13th of January, Lions throughout the world gather to pay tribute to Melvin Jones who said, "Dreams are the fool ideas of the day before yesterday that have become the commonplace of miracles of today."

Every journey begins with a single step. One act of service, one encouraging word, one gift of generosity is often all it takes to bring hope where it's needed most.




#### BIKES FOR THE WORLD

Our tri-partnership (Howard County Alpha Ridge Landfill, Bikes for the World & Glenwood Lions Club) effort began as a 10 month "pilot," April through October, project, collecting used bicycles that previously had been tossed in the "metal" collection section in our County's landfill. Collections, covered by several Club volunteers, were made only on Saturdays from 8 AM thru 1 PM. Our initial yield amounted to 205 units that were selected as worthy of recycling.

The pilot effort was found worthy of extension and expansion by the County Executive. Thus in January 2017, the landfill's moving message board announced that used bicycle donations would be accepted during the regular scheduled hours that the facility was open, Monday thru Saturday. Later in the year the Landfill supervisor provided a shed to house donations. By the end of calendar year 2018, our count of bikes selected to be salvaged for recycling amounted to 3,345. In calendar year 2019, we added another 1,458 units to the previous total that now stands at 4.803.

Bikes for the World operates out of a facility in Rockville, MD. Last year they shipped over 14,000 refurbished bikes worldwide to low-income communities where bikes are a priority mode of transportation. The organization has established partnerships in Barbados, Costa Rica, El Salvador, Honduras, Kenya, Mozambique, Panama, Philippines, South Africa and the United States, to name a few. Their motto, "Changing Lives one Bike at a Time." A very fitting motto match for "We Serve."









#### Healthy Maryland Eyes Reception in Annapolis

In an event sponsored by the Maryland Optometry Association (MOA), Lions from around the state were invited to the Healthy Maryland Eyes Reception in Annapolis. Optometrists and Lions, Knights of the Blind, talked to Maryland lawmakers about the importance of vision care.

Eye doctors from the MOA showcased exhibits on eye and vision health education. Many lawmakers and Lions tried out the Retinal Imaging device that showed the inside of the eyes for early detection. Healthy (and delicious) Eye-friendly food was served.

PDG Bob Bruce displayed low vision equipment and talked about the Lions Youth Foundation work. Lion John Mosier talked about LASH and Lions preschool vision screenings, while Lion June Livingston talked about the Lions voucher program and the high number of Marylanders unable to afford eye exams/glasses.

New member Lion Catherine Carter and her son Atticus collected glasses from lawmakers and their staff with the Eye Give Back 2020 for the Lion's Club Recycling for Sight Program. Delegate Terri Hill from District 12 (Howard and Baltimore County) had the highest number of glasses at 192 followed by Delegate Warren Miller from 9A (Howard and Carroll) at 21. Eye Give Back collected a total of 271 glasses.




