Wonder what that picture of a burning candle is at the bottom of this page? Mid-September brought Yom Kippur, the holiest day of the Jewish calendar and a time for atonement, repentance, and fasting. I know how solemn and important this moment is. I honor various traditions. I have long felt that regardless of one's faith, finding occasions for self-reflection, where your own failings with honesty and clarity, is a necessary and worthy exercise. We live in a time where the divides between us are stark and seem to be growing wider and more inescapable. We are living in a moment of rancor, when anger, fear and despair are widespread. We can see selfishness run amok, selfishness that is proving deadly in a time of a pandemic and not to mention climate crisis. We are also witnessing lies, increase in violence. Sustained reflection is required to try to change who we are. We must change our ways. I often ask myself, what any of us can do in the face of these destructive forces against progress and hope. I also recognize the problems we face require broad and sustained action. We could start by attempting to do one small thing that makes our fellow human beings and natural worlds better. Reaching out to even one person who you know may be lonely, picking up a little trash in a park or wherever we walk through, acknowledging and bringing in the awareness of violence and divisiveness that exists in our communities, drug addiction, bullying just to name a few. We can choose to end a hurtful line of discourse, microaggression, and systemic ISMs (racism, sexism etc. etc.). From our small actions, can come larger ones. Our momentum can build. We can join and partner with many local volunteer efforts. There are many organizations locally involved in reducing drug addiction, suicide prevention, gun violence control, cleaning and sustaining clean environment, various disease awareness and prevention, the list is endless. Let us see what we feel can be improved and then start a small movement to fix it. What is your passion and what gives you life? Recognize that we all can do more and have great potential. Remember, we talked about Olympians and the Boiling water in our meeting on August 14th. We all can choose at one of the countless inflection points of our lives to opt for positive action. Bottom line, just IMAGINE how we can change the world by changing ourselves. Following the words of Mahatma Gandhi: "BE THE CHANGE YOU WANT TO SEE IN THE WORLD."



SANITIZING AND PROCESSING GUIDANCE

While processing eyeglasses, hearing aids and cellphones, it is recommended you wear protective gloves, mask and face shield or some form of eye protection in event of cleaning agent splash. **EYEGLASSES:**

Sorting: **NO** cases, **NO** separate lenses; bag into separate into batches: 1) frames with Titanium - look for "Titanium" on ear piece; 2) readers; 3) regular prescription glasses and prescription sun glasses; 4) non-prescription sunglasses; 5) sample frames from optometrists; 6) broken frames

Sanitizing: use warm soapy water to wash eyeglasses, rinse, dry; can also use 50/50 water/ hydrogen peroxide solution or weak bleach solution

HEARING AIDS: do not have to be pre-sanitized. Towson University Hearing Center will take care of that when hearing aids are received.

<u>CELLPHONES:</u> Sanitize with alcohol wipe. **NO** cases; carefully sanitize phone itself; phone chargers will be accepted. If possible, attach charger to phone with rubber band or tape to keep them together. You could also put them in their own baggie.

LASH Secretary - attend quarterly Executive Committee and General Membership meetings, record and prepare meeting minutes, schedule quarterly General Membership breakfast/dinner meetings with selected locations. Executive Committee meetings are via Zoom and are recorded. The General Membership meetings are planned to be in person, but that may change to Zoom if the Maryland COVID statistics keep rising.

Mobile Health Screening Unit Chair - receive/schedule requests from clubs for use of the Mobile Health Screening Unit (LASH trailer); assist in training clubs who want to use the trailer in how to use the equipment.
