Fellow Lions, The semiannual LASH Eyeglasses Sorting event will take place on Saturday, 8 October from 8-11 AM at the Knefely Gym, Maryland School for the Blind. The school is located at 3501 Taylor Avenue, Nottingham, MD 21236. Please bring your eyeglasses, hearing aids, and cell-phones to the gym to sort. Masks are optional in the gym.

Eyeglasses get sorted as follows:

- 1) frames with Titanium or gold (look for "Titanium" on ear piece),
- 2) readers,
- 3) regular prescription glasses and prescription sun glasses,
- 4) non-prescription sunglasses,
- 5) broken frames,
- 6) sample frames with no prescription in lens.

Please throw out eyeglass, hearing aid, and cellphone cases. The exception is if the hearing aid case serves as a charging unit.

Unused hearing aid batteries and accessories will be accepted as well as charging cables for cellphones. Please use a rubber band or tape to keep the charging cable with the cellphone. Thanks,

## **NEWS FROM LVRF!!!**

The Pike Creek - Green Hills Lions Club (22-D) has issued a **Challenge** to all the Lions Clubs in Multiple District 22. ## Multiple District 22 Lions Leadership Institute at Camp Merrick

Camp Merrick is located on 320 acres on the shores of the Potomac River in southern Maryland. This beautiful site is owned and operated by the Lions of Lions of 22 C to serve children ages 6 to 16, who suffer from diabetes or are hearing or visually impaired, with a summer camp experiences. Camp Merrick is also supported financially by the Lions of MD 22 and rentals by outside groups during the fall through November.

Camp Merrick has a cluster of cabins with 6 or 8 double decker bunk beds (we are only using the lower ones) next to the main dinning room. Each cabin is winterized and has a bathroom in them. There are showers in a separate building next to the cabins. Lions will need to bring their own bedding for the bunk beds.

The learning experience will be enhanced by the sheer beauty of the site. The RLLI will not only be a learning experience for future leaders but a real retreat from the frantic lives that most of us experience. This a chance to build relationships with your fellow Lions of MD 22.





Hello Lions, family and friends.

First, let me introduce myself. I am the wife of Lion Mike Hall. I've been a travel advisor for over 30 years, working with Cruise Vacations International. We had a store front agency located in Rockville MD, but have been working from our home offices for over two years, thanks to the pandemic. Our company has been in business since 9/11/89. We focus on customer service, working to make your vacations the best possible experience. We began as a cruise-focused agency, but have since become full service for cruises, tours and independent travel.

This will be the fourth cruise adventure for the Lions that I will be managing. In the past, we've cruised to Canada/NE, Caribbean and Panama Canal. The cruise for late August 2023 is scheduled for Bermuda.

Bermuda is a beautiful scenic and friendly island off of the coast of Cape Hatteras NC. It is considered semi-tropical since it is located in the Atlantic. Bermuda is known for its pink-sand beaches, the Royal Naval Dockyard, and maritime history at the National Museum of Bermuda. The island is a blend of British and American culture. With its small size (22 miles in length), it's easy to get to most kodak moment places by water ferry or the public bus transportation system. And who can leave Bermuda without tasting a Rum Swizzle!

We are offering cabin accommodations for interior cabins (no window), ocean view cabins (picture window) and balcony cabin (private ocean view balcony with two upright chairs and a small table). The rates quoted below include the cruise, port tax and the additional gov't taxes/fees, and are per person, based on double occupancy (two passengers sharing the cabin). Cruise fares include your cabin accommodation, all meals in the main dining room and the Windjammer Café, complementary beverages such as coffee, tea, lemonade, fruit flavored punch, purified water, and the onboard daily entertainment:

Interior cabins (no window) from \$773.78 per person

Ocean view cabins (picture window) from \$853.78 per person

Balcony cabin (private ocean view veranda) from \$1338.78 per person

There may be other room categories (Jr. Suites, Grand Suites, etc.) available, pricing can be discussed at the time of inquiry/booking.

Optional Royal Caribbean CruiseCare (Travel Protection Plan) can be purchased (if you reside in NY, we would need to discuss alternate options) and will generally run between \$59-\$99 per person, depending on the category of accommodation you choose.

Additional expenses would include gratuities, currently pricing at \$14.50/day, per passenger (5 day cruise gratuities currently at \$72.50 per person), specialty dining in one of the specialty restaurants on board, room service, structured

shore excursions should you choose to participate in one of the cruise line tour options, alcoholic beverages and specialty coffees, Bingo, casino, etc.

Parking at the Port of Baltimore (Cruise Maryland) is running \$15/day (\$75 for a 5 night cruise) for 2022, we don't have the rates for 2023 yet.

#### FINANCIAL INFORMATION

The deposit required by Royal Caribbean is \$250 per person by credit card within a 3-5 days of making a reservation, refundable until the final payment is due in mid-May 2023

At the time of deposit, Cruise Vacations International will charge a non-refundable \$75 per cabin booking/management fee

The final balance will be due no later than Monday 5/22/23

Royal Caribbean does assess cancellation penalties after the final payment date:

5/29-6/12/23 at 25% of your cruise fare

6/13-6/26/23 at 50% of your cruise fare

6/27-7/26/23 at 75% of your cruise fare

7/27/23 to sailing at 100% of your cruise fare
