Multiple District 22 Lions Leadership Institute at Camp Merrick

Camp Merrick is located on 320 acres on the shores of the Potomac River in southern Maryland. This beautiful site is owned and operated by the Lions of Lions of 22 C to serve children ages 6 to 16, who suffer from diabetes or are hearing or visually impaired, with a summer camp experiences. Camp Merrick is also supported financially by the Lions of MD 22 and rentals by outside groups during the fall through November.

Camp Merrick has a cluster of cabins with 6 or 8 double decker bunk beds (we are only using the lower ones) next to the main dinning room. Each cabin is winterized and has a bathroom in them. There are showers in a separate building next to the cabins. Lions will need to bring their own bedding for the bunk beds.

The learning experience will be enhanced by the sheer beauty of the site. The RLLI will not only be a learning experience for future leaders but a real retreat from the frantic lives that most of us experience. This a chance to build relationships with your fellow Lions of MD 22.

DIABETES MINUTE Lion Diana Wailes, 22-A Diabetes Awareness Chair WHO IS AT RISK FOR PREDIABETES AND TYPE 2 DIABETES?

If you have these risk factors, you may be at higher risk than others for prediabetes and type 2 diabetes:

- You are overweight.
- You are 45 years of age or older.
- Your parent or sibling has type 2 diabetes.
- You are physically active fewer than 3 times per week.
- You ever gave birth to a baby that weighed more than 9 pounds.
- You ever had diabetes while pregnant (gestational diabetes).




Race and ethnicity also affect your risk. African Americans, Hispanic/Latino Americans, American Indians, Pacific Islanders, and some Asian Americans are at particularly high risk for type 2 diabetes.

Following are the percentage of people in the United States with diagnosed diabetes from 2018 to 2023:

- Non-Hispanic Blacks 12.1%
- Hispanics 11.8%
- Non-Hispanic Asians 9.5%
- Non-Hispanic Whites 7.4%

If you are at risk, talk to a healthcare professional about getting a blood sugar test.

These Fellows have not only conducted significant research which could have national implications but have reduced the waiting time for an appointment to the LVC to a few days or less. Lions! Get Ready for the new Lion Portal

DELAYED UNTIL FALL! But check out info below anyway...

We're preparing for the launch of the new Lion Portal. This refreshed experience will combine the functionality of MyLion, MyLCI, Insights and other tools into one cohesive and consistent experience.

To use the Lion Portal, Lions must have a unique email address (one that isn't shared with another member) in their Lion Account information. Additionally, phone numbers can no longer be used as log in credentials.

Here's how you can help Lions:

1. **Spread the word.** Make Lions — especially those who actively use their Lion Account — aware of the transition to the Lion Portal. Encourage them to make sure their member information is up to date and includes a unique email address.

2. **Prepare club officers.** Ask club officers to review the member records for their club, checking for any shared email addresses, and be prepared to help members update their information as needed.

3. Stay up to date. Check for news and updates on the Lion Portal webpage.

We appreciate your support in preparing for the transition to the new Lion Portal.
