## **CALL TO CONVENTION**

In accordance with our Constitution and By-Laws, I am issuing this official call to our District Convention to be held at Ashore Resort and Beach Club, 10100 Coastal Highway, Ocean City, MD 21842, April 18-21, 2024.

The District 22-A Business Meetings held in conjunction with the Multiple District 22 (MD22) Convention are convened for the purpose of discussion and/or action on those matters considered in the best interest of Lionism, as well as the election of a District Governor, a 1st Vice District Governor, and a 2nd Vice District Governor.

At the first 22-A Business Meeting on Saturday, April 20, 2024, PDG John Andrews, 22-A Nominations, Elections, and Credentials Chair, will review the nominations he has received and request first and second nominating speeches. At the second 22-A Business Meeting on Sunday, April 20, 2024, elections will be held. If no nominations for an office are received prior to the 30 day limit, nominations of willing and qualified candidates will be accepted from the floor.

The requirements for holding office are on the next page. Note that any member of a club in the District seeking the office of District Governor or Vice District Governor must file their intention to run, in writing, with PDG John Andrews (jhandrews@wans.net) at least thirty (30) days prior to the day of the Convention and furnish evidence of their compliance with said office as outlined on the next page.

## **DISTRICT 22-A BY-LAWS**

Volume 84, Issue 4

#### **ARTICLE 1**

#### **Nominations and Elections**

#### Section 4.

## a. A candidate for the office of district governor shall:

- (1) Be an active member in good standing of a chartered Lions club in good standing in their single or sub-district.
  - (2) Secure the endorsement of their club or a majority of the clubs in their single or sub-district.
- (3) Currently be serving as the first vice district governor within the district from which he/she is to be elected.
- (4) Only in the event the current 1st Vice District Governor does not stand for election as district governor, or if a vacancy in the position of 1st Vice District Governor exists at the time of the district convention, and, the 2nd Vice District Governor does not elect to run for the vacant office, any club member who fulfills the qualifications for the office of Vice District Governor as set forth in these by-laws or constitution and who is currently serving or who has served one (1) additional year as a member of the district cabinet, shall fulfill the requirements of subsection (3) of this section.

## b. A candidate for the office of 1st Vice District Governor shall:

- (1) Be an Active Member in good standing of a chartered Lions club in good standing in their single or sub-district.
  - (2) Secure the endorsement of their club or a majority of the clubs in their single or sub-district.
  - (3) Currently be serving as the 2nd Vice District Governor within the same district.
- (4) Only in the event the current 2nd Vice District Governor does not stand for election as 1st Vice District Governor, or if a vacancy in the position of 2nd Vice District Governor exists at the time of the district convention, any club member who fulfills the qualifications for the office of 2nd Vice District Governor as set forth in these by-laws or constitution shall fulfill the requirements of subsection (3) of this section.

#### c. A candidate for the office of 2nd Vice District Governor shall:

- (1) Be an Active Member in good standing of a chartered Lions club in good standing in their single or sub-district.
  - (2) Secure the endorsement of their club or a majority of the clubs in their single or sub-district.
  - (3) Have served or will have served at the time he/she takes office as 2nd Vice District Governor.
  - (a) As President of a Lions club for a full term or major portion thereof, and a member of the board of directors of a Lions club for no less than two (2) additional years; and
  - (b) As Zone Chair or Region Chair or Cabinet Secretary and/or Treasurer for a full term or major portion thereof.
    - (c) With none of the above being accomplished concurrently.
  - (4) Has not completed a full term or a major portion thereof as District Governor.

## Some USA/Canada Lions Leadership Forum History

September 30 – October 2, 1977

The idea of the USA Forum came from the Lions International President, Joe McLoughlin, and he asked Norm Dahl to head the forum and asked me to be the officer to Assist.

The host leadership for the forum was Norm Dahl, John Oberweiss and Phil Tom with Past International President Johnny Balbo as Honorary Chairman. The featured speakers were Senator Bob Dole, Coach Bob Dole, Coach Bob Devaney (Nebraska) and International President Joe McLoughlin. The financial responsibility of the Forum was that of the Lions of Illinois and they reported that they broke even. The Illinois Lions asked for an advance contribution of \$100.00 from Past Presidents and Past International Directors. It was all returned. Approximately \$1000.00 was forwarded to Detroit for the 1978 Forum.



The adjacent photo shows Lion Joe with the layout and scene he created (with lots of help from his wife Lisa) and was featured on the front page of the local County newspaper, The Aegis. During the weekend Darlington manned the display, a couple hours were set aside for blind children to attend. Joe gave personalized attention to each child allowing them to operate the train controls, feel the platform vibrations from the train, and hear the locomotives as they passed. Nearly 250 persons visited the display over the 2 days.

The club was also busy with its Christmas food basket project and toy store. Ten Lions gathered to sort and pack the food into baskets. The toys that had been collected were arranged by age group and gender. And coats were sorted and grouped by size. In the end, 29 families were adopted with each family receiving a traditional holiday meal that included a turkey and all the sides plus a \$100 grocery card to a local supermarket. All told, nearly \$4400 in food and grocery cards were distributed to community members who needed a helping hand.

The Department of Service and Civic Innovation was established by the Serving Every Region Through Vocational Exploration (SERVE) Act of 2023 with the purpose of promoting service and volunteerism in the state of Maryland. The SERVE Act also launched two new exciting service pathways for eligible youth and adults, in addition to existing volunteer and service opportunities available through the Governor's Office on Service and Volunteerism and Volunteer Maryland.

## Service Year Option (For Young Adults ages 18, 19, 20, or 21)

The Service Year Option is an opportunity for those who recently completed high school, received their high school completion certificate or earned their GED in Maryland. Members will serve across the state of Maryland in organizations that will provide job training, mentorship and other resources to be successful all while earning \$15 an hour plus focused professional development time each week.

## Maryland Corps (For Adults of All Ages)

Maryland Corps is an opportunity for people of all ages interested in performing public and community service in Maryland. Like the Service Year Option, members will work in organizations that will provide job training and professional development, and earn a minimum of \$15 dollars an hour.

**Lions Clubs International & Diabetes Awareness** 

Diabetes has a large effect on our communities. An estimated 463 million adults across the world live with diabetes and its prevalence is increasing rapidly. By 2045, the number is expected to reach 700 million. Research has found that the rate of people being diagnosed with prediabetes and diabetes has been rising across the globe for many years. Diabetes is a global epidemic that touches every corner of the globe. Lions and Lions Clubs are working to reduce the prevalence of diabetes and improve the lives of those living with type II diabetes.



DIABETES IN MARYLAND According to the Maryland Behavioral Risk Factor Surveillance System

- 4 10.5 % of Maryland adults have diabetes
- 34% of Maryland adults have prediabetes (approximately 1.6 million people)

## Risk factors for diabetes include:

- Being overweight or obese
- Age (risk increases as age increases)
- Race or ethnicity
- Poor nutrition and lack of physical activity
- Tobacco use
- Prediabetes and gestational diabetes
- Social determinants such as income and education level

**Diabetes Awareness Ribbons** allow Lions to become active in reducing the cause and raising awareness of diabetes. By raising small donations and handing out this small ribbon we hope to bring awareness to those with diabetes.

**Diabetes Awareness Ribbons** raise funds to help by sending kids to diabetes camps, providing literature for coping with diabetes, cookbooks, diet planning, and literature.

All of the funds raised with Diabetes Awareness Ribbons will go toward diabetes awareness and helping those with diabetes. That's the Lions' commitment.
