We had another dynamic speaker, Jeff Hawkins along with his Leader Dog "Dove' from Waterford, Michigan. Jeff spoke about being diagnosed with "juvenile macular degeneration" when he was in his twenties until later becoming legally blind. He had to give up his professional career in the paramedic industry overseeing a team of over 500 employees. Jeff had an extraordinary story to tell about going into depression, staying isolated at home and actually feeling like giving up. He finally overcame his condition when he was introduced to the possibility of having a Leader Dog, from Leader Dog for the Blind. His



story was informative, empowering and uplifting! I'm sure some of us left feeling that we all have the human spirit and fortitude to handle many of the difficult situations that life can throw at us!

Remember, "Lions make a difference and you give people hope to have the will and courage to lead a better Life!"


HARFORD COUNTY LIONS PROJECT
